At Iowa Public Radio we work to inform, enrich, and engage Iowans through radio programming and other media. I believe that Rick Fredericksen's feature expanded our understanding of the natural world and Ben Keiffer's interview informed us about a culture which we, as Iowans, are not as familiar with as we might be. Bob Dorr played music by a local artist to share Iowa's own rich cultural life, connecting us with our in-state talent. And didn't Barney Sherman's tribute express the feelings of all Iowa Public Radio listeners, giving sympathy and support to those with an unexpected difficult year ahead of them?

We have often celebrated our achievements, sharing them with you, believing that as part of our family you are interested in knowing about how we work to improve our service. But sometimes in focusing on our achievements and strengths we don't share our shortcomings and frustrations. We forget that as family you are there to help us

through our challenges as well as our celebrations.

For example, we still have work to do to improve our on-air sound. We've had "dead air" that interferes with your listening experience that haven't been relevant to where you live. As we've compressed our streams we may have reduced your access to information and music that you need and love. These seemingly small issues are rooted in complex causes and I want to assure you that our commitment to getting it right and improving our service is strong.

As we continue our work we make choices that you might disagree with, but those decisions will be informed by our listeners. We won't always find a compromise, but afterwards we might all understand both sides of the issue better. In the end, Iowa Public Radio will only be as good as our dedicated staff and listeners make it, and with that in mind I want to thank you for your comments and feedback. Keep it up. We want to hear from you regarding story ideas and music requests, we want to have discussions with you about our programming choices, and we want to make this the best public radio we can.

Thank you for your support, I look forward to listening with you this fall.

IPR Announces News Director

Iowa Public Radio welcomes Jonathan Ahl to the newly created position of IPR News Director. In his role, Ahl will be responsible for leading the news department as an essential news service, focusing on the production and promotion of award-winning, in-depth stories and series, and ensuring editorial integrity in newscasts.

Ahl comes to IPR from WCBU-FM in Peoria, IL where he served as news director and as an on-air host and producer. He also served as a part-time instructor at Bradley University teaching public affairs, broadcast news and basic reporting in addition to journalistic writing. Ahl is the current board president for the PRNDI which represents public

radio news directors around the country.

"Jonathan brings solid journalistic credentials to the position, along with a Midwest sensibility and tremendous enthusiasm to work with our talented and experienced staff," expressed

KHKE 89.5 FM Back to Full Power!

In February 2007, the top half of the KHKE tower collapsed due to extreme icing and high wind. Portions of the tower also fell across the power-line feed wires and the arc surge damaged the transmitter and other equipment at the site. Neither the tower nor the antenna was repairable.

The reconstruction project included a new tower, transmitter building, digital transmitter, antenna and microwave relay system. Approximately two-thirds of the project was funded by federal grants with completion occurring in early summer.

AN EVENING WITH David Sedaris

You have heard him on Iowa Public Radio's *This American Life*, *Morning Edition*, and *Fresh Air* and now is your opportunity to see him live in Des Moines on October 9!

With sardonic wit and incisive social critiques, David Sedaris has become one of America's pre-eminent humor writers. The great skill with which he slices through cultural euphemisms and political correctness proves that he is a master of satire and one of the most observant writers addressing the human condition today.

Sedaris is the author of the bestsellers *Barrel Fever* and *Holidays on Ice*, as well as collections of personal essays, *Naked*, *Me Talk Pretty One Day*, and *Dress Your Family in Corduroy and Denim*, each of which became

immediate bestsellers. He is the editor of an anthology of stories, *Children Playing Before a Statue of Hercules: An Anthology of Outstanding Stories*. His essays appear regularly in *Esquire* and *The New Yorker*.

Sedaris' original radio pieces can often be heard on *This American Life*, broadcast Saturdays at 1 p.m. and Sundays at 2 p.m. on the Iowa Public Radio News network. In 2001, he became the third recipient of the Thurber Prize for American Humor. He was named by *Time* magazine as "Humorist of the Year" in 2001. He was also nominated for two Grammy Awards for Best Spoken Word Album ("Dress Your Family in Corduroy & Denim") and Best Comedy Album ("David Sedaris: Live at Carnegie Hall"). The release of his latest book, *When*

You're Engulfed in Flames, is again bringing him to Iowa.

Sedaris will be performing at 7:30 p.m. on the main stage of the Civic Center of Greater Des Moines. Visit iowapublicradio.org for ticket information.

2008 Fall Blues Blowout

American bluesman Kenny Neal brings his axe to Waterloo's Electric Park Ballroom on November 22 for the 2008 Fall Blues Blowout, presented by the Friends of KUNI/KHKE.

Let Life Flow marks the return of multi-instrumentalist and modern swamp-blues master Kenny Neal, with an inspired set that draws musically from the sizzling sounds of his native Louisiana, while striking a deep, emotional resonance in response to the personal trials he has recently endured. For the past few years, health problems forced Kenny away from the studio and touring, and his first release since signing with Blind Pig Records finds him returning with a renewed vigor and outlook on life. *Let Life Flow* reflects his optimistic sense of perseverance, set to the soulful grooves that have garnered him a solid fan base over the past twenty years.

Commenting on his recent return to recording and performing with *Let Life Flow*, Kenny said, "With all the tragedy and darkness I've been through in the past three years, I'm finally seeing the light. I've been waiting for a long time for a record company to say 'Make a record that you feel good about.' Blind Pig Records gave me that opportunity. And my new CD, *Let Life Flow*, is coming straight from my heart. Hope

everyone enjoys it."

Opening the show is the 2008 Iowa Blues Challenge winner, the Avey Brothers, from Davenport. Showtime is 8 p.m.

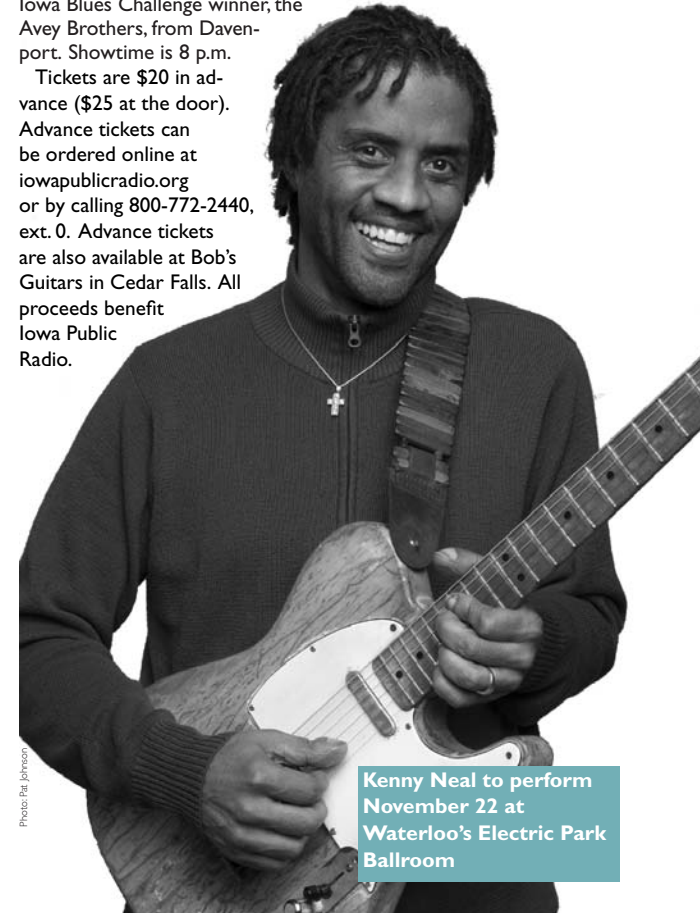

HEARING VOICES

Iowa Public Radio welcomes a new program to the news network's weekend line-up.

Hearing Voices is a weekly one-hour program of contemporary and classic storytelling by established and emerging public radio producers crafted together under a thematic umbrella. The show's producers pick from

broadcasts and podcasts, dig through audio archives, and scour the web. Each hour is a collection of "driveway moments" built around a theme (one hour is on Rock Fans, another about Retirement Homes; one week we tell Dog Tales, another Desert Stories) and features a different guest host. The series is based

on the Hearing Voices Peabody Award-winning specials.

Hearing Voices airs Sundays at 6 a.m. on KUNI, WSUI, KWOI/KTPR/KOWI, and WOI-AM and Sundays at 10 p.m. on WSUI and WOI-AM. *Hearing Voices* occupies the spots left by *Justice Talking* and *Word for Word*, which are both no longer in production.

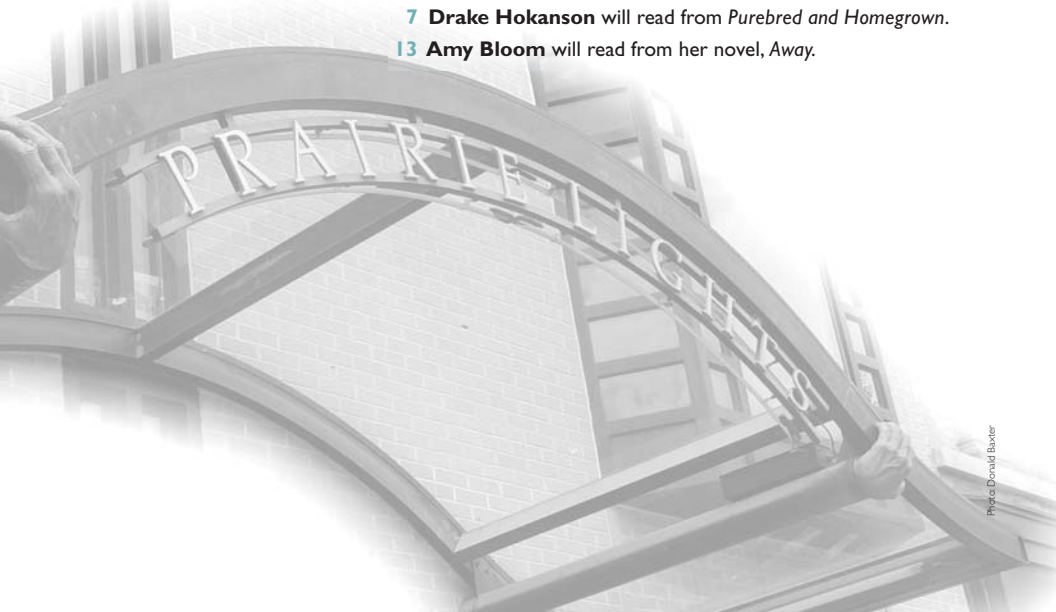

Iowa Public Radio is a growing organization and in order to expand our services and remain financially healthy, we are looking to expand our new donor base.

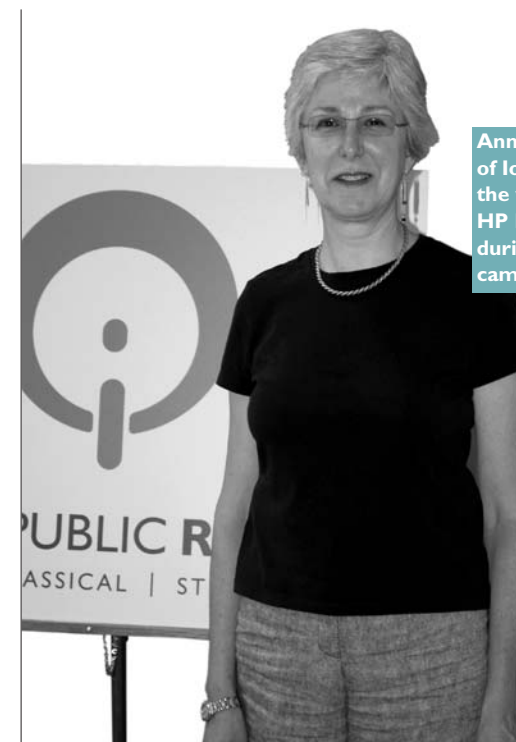

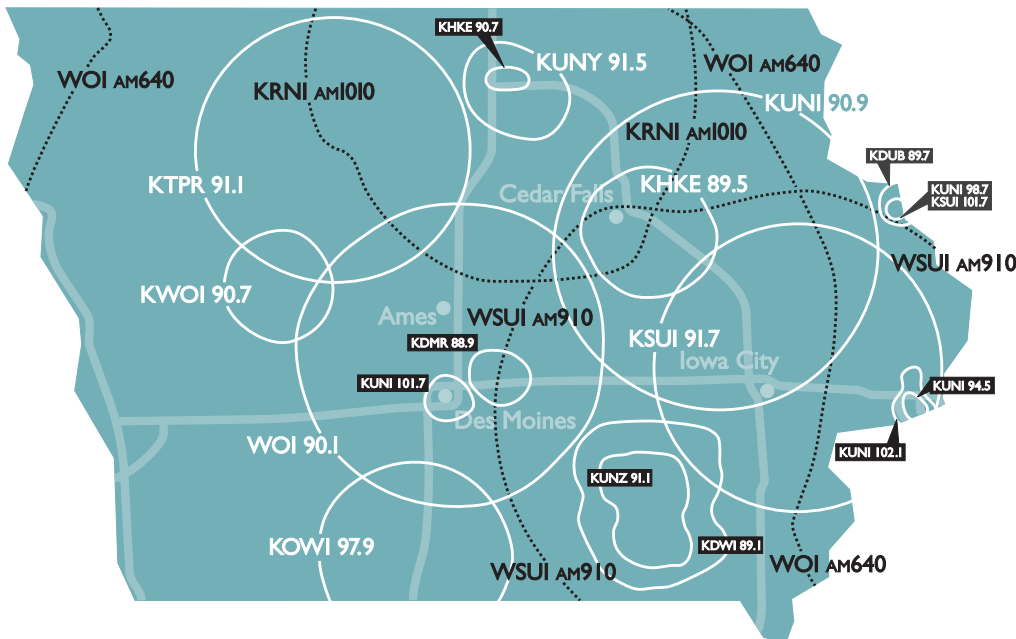

Gifts of Life Insurance

Iowa Public Radio was the recent recipient of a charitable gift funded by the donor's life insurance policy. Life insurance can be an easy way for an individual to make a substantial gift. Here are some guidelines to keep in mind when considering a charitable gift funded with life insurance.

When you donate a life insurance policy to Iowa Public Radio on an "irrevocable" basis (you make IPR the owner and beneficiary of the policy, giving up the right of ownership associated with the policy, like changing the beneficiary or borrowing on the policy), you can claim an income tax deduction for the policy's cost basis (not a deduction for the face value of the policy) or the cash surrender value, whichever is the lesser amount.

If the policy still requires premium payments, the donor can receive an income tax deduction equivalent for each premium paid. The donor can pay the premiums directly to the insurance company or make a gift to IPR for the premium amount and IPR will pay the premium.

Who knows? You may even have a paid-up life insurance policy that you don't need or forgot about, which could provide a meaningful charitable gift! As with all planned gifts, you should consult with your professionals before making the gift.
